WHEREAS, in 2018 the City retained the services of EMH&T Engineering, Surveyors, Planners & Scientists to conduct a survey and create a Parks Master Plan that encompassed all city-owned park land.

WHEREAS, over the last two years EMH&T Engineering, Surveyors, Planners & Scientists conducted aforesaid survey by gathering numerous analysis points, public input, and ascertaining specialized information to create a Parks Master Plan that maximizes the efficiency of, and optimizes the usefulness of, all Parks Department assets including all city-owned park land.

WHEREAS, on April 7, 2020, EMH&T Engineering, Surveyors, Planners & Scientists submitted to the City a final Master Plan that the City Administration wishes City Council would adopt and pledge support for.

Authorizing the City of Mansfield to transfer to the Richland County Land Reutilization Corporation ten properties located within the City, specifically identified in section 1 of this Ordinance, which no longer serve a public purpose and are unneeded and no longer required for public park purposes.

WHEREAS, the properties authorized for transfer herein are available to the City for transfer to the Richland County Land Reutilization Corporation, having been acquired by the City through the City's Parks and Recreation Department, and no longer have a valid public purpose, are unneeded and no longer required for park purposes, and Ohio Revised Code 1724.10(B)(3) authorizes the City to convey said parcels without the advertising or receipt of bids.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. SECTION 4. That this measure shall take effect and be in force after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Honoring K-9 dog Ferro upon his retirement from the Mansfield Police Department.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That this Council, on behalf of the government and the citizens of the City of Mansfield, is privileged to honor and pay tribute to Ferro upon his retirement with the Mansfield Police Department, K-9 Unit on October 20, 2020.

K-9 Ferro came to the Mansfield Division of Police in August 2017. He was imported from Czechoslovakia and his primary language is German. He is a Belgian Malinois/ German Shepherd. K-9 Ferro and K-9 Officer Joshua Frech graduated from the Mansfield Training Academy on December 17, 2017 with their OPOTA certification in both Narcotics and Patrol Operations.

During K-9 Ferro's time with the Mansfield Division of Police, he and Officer Frech handled a total of 227 incidents. K-9 Ferro was used for 189 Drug Searches on vehicles which resulted in 1,961 grams of narcotic seizures, 6 Burglaries and 3 Assaults with a Weapon incidents. He and Officer Frech attended 13 canine demonstrations to the public and schools. Officer Frech and K-9 Ferro assisted the K-9 Unit in hosting the USPCA Region 5 K-9 trials, here in Mansfield in May 2020.

K-9 Ferro will retire to Officer Joshua Frech and his family.

We extend our appreciation for Frech's years of loyal service and wish him a comfortable retirement.

Amending Chapter 195 of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances (Transient Occupancy Tax) to extend the tax through December 31, 2023, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, effective January 1, 1988, Ordinance #87-291 imposed a Transient Occupancy Tax at the rate of three percent (3%) on the furnishing of lodging by motels to transient guests, as allowed by R.C. 5739.02(C)(1) (now R.C.5709.08(A)), and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance #98-306, passed December 15, 1998, the Transient Occupancy Tax was extended an additional three (3) years from January 1, 1999 to December 31, 2001, and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance #99-033, passed February 16, 1999 the Transient Occupancy Tax proceeds were reallocated and extended an additional seven (7) years from January 1, 1999 to December 31, 2005.

WHEREAS, by Ordinance #05-269, passed December 20, 2005, the Transient Occupancy Tax was extended an additional six (6) years from January 1, 2006 to December 31, 2011, and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance #11-213, passed December 20, 2011, the Transient Occupancy Tax was extended an additional year from January 1, 2012 to December 31, 2012, and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance #12-225, passed December 18, 2012, the Transient Occupancy Tax was extended an additional year from January 1, 2013 to December 31, 2013, and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance #13-359, passed December 17, 2013, the Transient Occupancy Tax was extended an additional year from January 1, 2014 to December 31, 2014, and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance #14-280, passed December 16, 2014, the Transient Occupancy Tax was extended for an additional (3) years from January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2017.

WHEREAS, by Ordinance #17-212, passed November 7, 2017, the Transient Occupancy Tax was extended for an additional (3) years from January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2020.

WHEREAS, this Council deems it appropriate and in the best interest of the City of Mansfield to extend the imposition of the Transient Occupancy Tax an additional three (3) years from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That Section 195.02(a) of Chapter 195 of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances, as amended, pertaining to the City Transient Occupancy Tax be, and the same is hereby, amended to provide as follows:

A195.02 RATE OF TAX

- (a) Commencing on January 1, 2021 and expiring on December 31, 2023, there is levied a tax of three percent (3%) on all rents received by a hotel for lodging furnished to transient guests with total receipts applied as follows:
